About Our Medical Centre:

Eastbrooke Medical Centre Carlton is located at 354 –356 Railway Parade. The Centre offers patients comprehensive care: General Practitioners, Registered Nursing staff and Treatment Room, onsite Pathology, Psychologist, and Dietician.

For your convenience, onsite Pharmacy is available for your prescription and other pharmaceutical needs.

Eastbrooke GPs have varied interests in Men's, Women's and Children's Health in addition to Chronic Disease Management and Preventative Care. The centre is also equipped to deal with work based injuries and return to work programs.

Appointments:

Please ring our Reception Desk on (02) 8580 1777 for an appointment. Every effort will be made to accommodate your preferred time and GP. Appointments are usually made at 15-minute intervals. Emergencies will always be given priority and our reception staff will attempt to contact you if there is any unforeseen delay or your GP has been called away. Longer consultation times are available so please ask our receptionists if you require some extra time.

<u>Note:</u> reception phones close at 5:00 PM Monday – Friday. All calls made at or after 5:00 PM Monday – Friday will be automatically diverted to Sydney Medical Service After Hours line on (02) 8724 6300.

If you or a family member requires an interpreter, we can organise this for you. Please let us know when you make an appointment.

Online Booking System:

If you prefer, we also have an online booking system in place. To make an appointment online, please go to: <u>www.eastbrookemedical.com.au</u>, select location: Carlton, and then select: Online Booking System. You will then be prompted to fill out your details.

Both existing patients and new patients are welcome to use our online booking system.

Fees and Billing Arrangement:

We are a Mixed Billing Practice. Some of our practitioner's bulk bill in certain circumstances, however it is important to note that <u>all billings are at the discretion of the General Practitioner</u>.

Centrelink pension, concession, and health care card holders, as well as children under 16 years of age, are bulk billed. <u>A private fee will typically apply for all other patients.</u>

<u>Note:</u> Bulk billed patients may be required to pay a private fee for certain bookings or as walk-ins without appointments. Please ask our receptionists when making a booking for further information.

We accept payment via cash, cheque, EFTPOS using MasterCard or Visa, as well as electronic bank transfer. <u>Note:</u> American Express is not accepted.

Only Centrelink pension, concession, and health care card holders, as well as children under 16 years of age, are bulk billed.

Our Weekend After-Hour Rates are as Follows:

Standard Consultation (Level B)	\$115.00	<15 minutes in duration
Long Consultation (Level C)	\$155.00	>15 minutes in duration
Prolonged Consultation (Level D)	\$185.00	>40 minutes in duration

On Saturday and Sunday, the Schedule of Fees <u>applies</u> for Centrelink pension, concession, and health care card holders, as well as children, at the <u>discretion of the General</u> <u>Practitioner</u>.

Our Centre may also require both private patients and bulk billing patients to pay an out of pocket fee for dressings, vaccines, and procedures. This will be discussed with your Doctor and Nurse during your consultation.

After Hours:

If medical attention is required outside operating hours, a telephone call to the Medical Centre on 02 8580 1777 will put you in contact with our after-hours care provider, Sydney Medical Service who are an accredited medical deputising service.

The doctors in this practice also participate in an after-hours roster whereby they may be contacted through the medical deputising service between the hours of 5AM and 8AM, Monday to Friday, for patients who may need direct advice.

Home Visits:

Home visits may be available for patients whose condition prevents them from attending the Medical Centre.

Please note that this is up to the discretion and arrangement of your doctor. A phone consult will need to be organised to discuss this with the doctor.

Telephone Access:

Doctors in the Medical Centre may be contacted during normal operating hours by making a booking for a telephone consultations.

In an emergency, your call will always be put through to either the Doctor or Nurse.

Parking and Disabled Access:

Car parking is available in the adjacent streets with a number of parking spaces located conveniently at the front of the Medical Centre, which includes disabled car parking space.

Your Feedback, Quality and Improvement:

We have a feedback form and box located on the reception desk for patients to provide feedback. We take our feedback very seriously and will try and improve on any recommendations made from our patients.

Reminders System:

Our practice is committed to preventative care. Your doctor will seek your permission to be included on our national/state reminder system/registers.

You will receive SMS appointment reminders 24 hours prior to each appointment. We will also issue you with a reminder notice from time to time offering you preventive health services appropriate to your care.

Clinical reminders and pathology/radiology results recalls may also be sent to you via SMS.

If you do not wish to be part of this system, you may opt out by replying 'STOP' to the next SMS you receive from us. Alternatively, you may also inform your Doctor or Reception.

Medical Records and Privacy:

Your medical record is a confidential document. It is the policy of this practice to maintain security of personal health information at all times and ensure this information is only available to authorised members of staff.

Eastbrooke Medical Centre's complies with the Privacy Act 1988 and the Australian Privacy Principles 2014 including the way we collect, store, use and disclose health information.

For more information, please ask for a copy of our Privacy Policy Statement at reception. Should you require access to your medical information held by this Centre, please discuss this with your Doctor or the Practice Manager.

Patient's right to participate in decisions about their healthcare:

If you have any questions regarding the purpose, importance, benefits, risks and possible out of pocket costs associated with your treatment, don't hesitate to speak with your doctor.
